

Slapjack

2-8 players

52 cards

Difficulty: Easy

Duration: Short

Collect all 52 cards by being the first to slap the pile when a Jack appears.

SETUP

- Deal the entire deck face-down as evenly as possible.
- Players do not look at their cards.

SCORING

- Collect all 52 cards to win.
- If you run out, you get one last chance to slap a Jack.
- Miss that slap and you are eliminated.

Tip: Keep your hand hovering near the pile and watch each card as it flips.

ON YOUR TURN

- Flip your top card onto the center pile, facing away from you.
- When a Jack appears, race to slap the pile first.
- Winner of the slap takes all cards in the pile.
- False slaps cost you your top card as a penalty.

Slapjack is an energetic card game for all ages where players take turns flipping cards onto a central pile. When a Jack appears, the first player to slap the pile wins all the cards. It combines luck with lightning-fast reflexes.

Objective

Collect all 52 cards by being the quickest to slap the pile whenever a Jack is revealed.

Setup

1. **Players:** 2 to 8 players.
2. **Deck:** Standard 52-card deck.
3. **Deal:** Deal the entire deck face-down as evenly as possible. Players do not look at their cards.

Gameplay

1. **Flipping Cards:** Starting with the player left of the dealer, each player flips the top card of their pile onto the center pile, turning it away from themselves so everyone sees it at the same time.
2. **Slapping:** When a Jack is played, all players race to slap the pile. The first hand to touch the pile wins all the cards in it, which are added to the bottom of the winner's pile.
3. **False Slaps:** If you slap when there is no Jack, you must give the top card of your pile to the player who played the last card.
4. **Running Out:** If you run out of cards, you have one more chance — you may still slap the next Jack to get back in. If you miss, you are eliminated.

Winning

The game continues until one player has collected all 52 cards.

Tips and Strategies

- Keep your hand hovering near the pile to react faster.
- Watch each card as it is flipped — anticipation beats reaction time.
- Avoid false slaps, as losing cards to penalties adds up quickly.

Tips & Strategy

Position your hand close to the center pile without obstructing other players. Focus your attention on the cards, not on other players' hands.

The main strategic element is avoiding false slaps. Every penalty card you give away extends the game against you.
